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## COMMISSIONERS' MEETING MINUTES

**January 21, 2021**

### 1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

The public meeting of the Chester County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 10:01 AM on January 21, 2021 via webinar by the Chair of the Board of Commissioners, Marian D. Moskowitz. Commissioner Josh Maxwell and Commissioner Michelle Kichline were also present.

### 2. ANNOUNCEMENTS

Ray McGarry of Brown, McGarry, and Nimeroff presented his findings on the investigation into Chester County's COVID-19 antibody test kit procurement. Mr. McGarry noted that the County staff and administration did not act inappropriately, criminally, or unethically at any time. He did identify areas for improvement and offered recommendations to correct those areas, which will be implemented. He stressed that in this unprecedented time, he believes everyone acted in the best interests of the County and its citizens given the circumstances.

### ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chester County Controller Margaret Reif presented the preliminary findings of the Controller's Office review of the antibody test kit purchase. She noted that her office did not find any instance of fraudulent or criminal activity. She did find areas for improvement and offered recommendations to address those areas, which the County will be implementing.

Chair Moskowitz charged County Administrator Bobby Kagel with leading the review of the recommendations and developing a corrective action plan. Commissioner Kichline stressed the importance of discussing the corrective action plan in a public meeting and providing regular updates in public meetings.

Chair Moskowitz announced that the Board of Commissioners met in Executive Session on Thursday, January 21, 2021 to discuss personnel and legal matters.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**  
**By and Between**  
**The County of Delaware and SEPA Regional Partners**

This **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** (“Agreement”) is entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2021 (the “Effective Date”), by and between the County of Delaware, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (the “County”), and the Southeastern Pennsylvania Regional Partners (“SEPA Partners”)<sup>1</sup>, for the purpose of setting forth the Parties’ promises and agreements with respect to the configuration, installation and maintenance of a software application (the “Application”) and related hardware that will be used to establish bi-directional interoperability between the SEPA Partners’ Computer Aided Dispatch (“CAD”) systems to assist with delivery of 911 and disaster recovery services to the public; and

**WHEREAS**, the County is the recipient of a grant (the “PEMA Grant”) from the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency under the 9-1-1 Statewide Interconnectivity Funding Program in the maximum amount of \$1,789,816.00 to pay the costs of the Application; and

**WHEREAS**, the County (following the recommendations of the scoring team established by the SEPA Partners and the approval by the SEPA Partners’ 911 Coordinators, has engaged CentralSquare Technologies, LLC (“CS”) to install its Unify implementation of the CAD-to-CAD Hub, the terms of which engagement are set forth in the Software Subscription and Services Agreement (the “CS Contract”) between the County and CS.

**WHEREAS**, the Application will be installed in connection with the SEPA Partners existing CAD systems; and

**WHEREAS**, the Parties desire to memorialize their understanding of the rights and responsibilities of each Party with respect to the installation of the Application.

**NOW THEREFORE**, the County and SEPA Partners, in consideration of the promises and agreements set forth below, together with other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is acknowledged by both the County and SEPA Partners, and intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

1. **RECITALS.** The foregoing Recitals are incorporated in and made a part of this Agreement.

2. **TERM AND RENEWAL; SURVIVAL.**

(a) ***Term.*** The term of this Agreement shall be for a one (1) year period commencing on the Effective Date and ending on the one-year anniversary of such date (the “Initial Term”) and will automatically renew for additional one-year renewal periods until the termination of the CS Contract unless the County provides SEPA Partners with notice of termination, as set forth in Section 3 below. All terms and conditions of this MOU shall remain in effect at the time of renewal, unless the Parties hereto mutually agree in writing to amend the terms and conditions.

(b) ***Survival.*** The following terms of the Agreement shall survive any termination of the Agreement by failure of any Party to renew as provided in Subsection 2(a): Sections 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13(b), (c), (e), and (h).

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<sup>1</sup> The SEPA Partners are each a “Party” to this Agreement and include the following counties: Delaware County, Chester County, Berks County, Montgomery County, Bucks County and Philadelphia County. The County and SEPA Partners are collectively referred to as “Parties” herein and each as a “Party.”



3. **TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT.**

The County may terminate this Agreement with any or all SEPA Partners, and any SEPA Partner may terminate its participation in this Agreement, in each case for any reason, including for convenience, as long as it provides at least ninety (90) days written notice to all Parties. The Parties further recognize and agree that no Party is obligated to any other Party, and that nothing in this Agreement permits a Party to obligate any other Party, for any costs associated with termination under applicable tariffs, contracts or agreements.

4. **FUNDING ARRANGEMENT.**

The County agrees that it shall have sole responsibility for all costs associated with CS's implementation, installation and maintenance of the Application and related hardware. The Parties acknowledge that it is intended that all such costs will be paid from funds under the PEMA Grant, and no Party is obligated hereunder to make any payments from any source of funds other than funds paid under the PEMA Grant.

5. **RESTRICTED USE.**

The Parties shall not take any action or utilize the Application in any way that will jeopardize the goal of implementing bi-directional CAD-to-CAD interoperability among the SEPA Partners.

6. **APPLICATION PROVIDED.**

CS will provide the software subscription to the Application as well as related hardware and implementation, installation and maintenance services as set forth in the Statement of Work attached to the Agreement and which is also included as Exhibit A hereto.

7. **MAINTENANCE.**

The CS Contract includes provisions requiring CS to provide support and maintenance services for the Application. Payment of costs for support and maintenance is governed by Section 4, above.

8. **CONFIDENTIALITY.**

The Parties, during the term of this Agreement or at any time thereafter, shall not, without the express written mutual consent, directly or indirectly divulge or use for its own benefit or for the benefit of any other third party, any of each other's trade secrets, proprietary data, or any other confidential information communicated to or otherwise learned or acquired during their mutual relationship. However, a Party may disclose such information to the extent that such disclosure is required during their relationship with each other, or if such disclosure is demanded by a court or other governmental agency of competent jurisdiction or as otherwise required by applicable law. Prompt notice shall be given by such Party to the applicable other Party to provide that Party with an opportunity to intervene to protect its information.

9. **NOTICES.**

Any notice ("Notice") that the Parties may be required to or may desire to give to another Party shall be in writing and shall be sent via first class U.S. Mail, or to such other person(s) or place(s) as may be designated in writing by one Party to the other Party. Contact information for each SEPA Partner for Notices pursuant to this Section 9 is set forth on the applicable signature page.

10. **INSURANCE.**

(a) Each of the Parties shall, at its sole cost and expense, procure and maintain in full force and effect, Commercial General Liability insurance as specified below, or shall provide self-insurance as described below. The insurance shall be procured from reputable insurers admitted to conduct business on a direct basis in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or otherwise acceptable to the County. The insurance shall be written on an "occurrence" basis and not a "claims made" basis. Each of the Parties shall provide for at least thirty (30) days written notice to be given to the County in the event its respective coverage is materially changed, canceled or non-renewed.

**Commercial General Liability.** Limit of Liability: \$2,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury (including death) and property damage liability. The limit may be met in combination with excess/umbrella coverage. Coverage shall include premises operations; blanket contractual liability; personal injury liability; independent contractors; employees as additional insureds; cross liability; broad form property damage.

(b) The County shall require CS to obtain the insurance set forth in Section 18.11 of the CS Contract. CS shall name each SEPA Partner as an additional insured on its Commercial General Liability policy.

(c) To the extent permitted by law, any Party may be self-insured against claims to persons or property subject to the immunities, rights and defenses available to it in accordance with the provisions of the Pennsylvania Political Subdivision Tort Claims Act, 42 Pa. C.S.A. § 8541, et seq., as amended.

11. **INDEMNIFICATION.**

Each Party shall, to the extent permitted by applicable law, indemnify, defend and hold harmless each other Party, its officers, employees and agents, from and against any and all losses, costs (including, but not limited to, litigation and settlement costs, counsel fees and expenses), claims, suits, actions, damages, liability and expenses, occasioned wholly or in part by the indemnifying Party's own act or omission or negligence or fault or the act or omission or negligence or fault of the indemnifying Party's own agents, subcontractors, independent contractors, suppliers, employees or servants in connection with this Agreement, including, but not limited to, those in connection with loss of life, bodily injury, personal injury, damage to property, contamination or adverse effects on the environment, failure to pay such subcontractors and suppliers, any breach of this Agreement, and any infringement or violation of any proprietary right (including, but not limited to, patent, copyright, trademark, service mark and trade secret). This obligation shall survive the termination of this Agreement. If an indemnifying Party is responsible only in part for the losses, costs, claims, suits, actions, damages or liabilities, or two or more Parties are required to indemnify another Party to this Agreement as provided in this Paragraph and determined by a court of law, then the obligation of each such indemnifying Party shall be limited to the amount, expressed as a percentage of the whole, that the indemnifying Party's own act or omission or negligence or fault, or the act or omission or negligence or fault of the indemnifying Party's own agents, subcontractors, independent contractors, suppliers, employees or servants caused or resulted in, it being the intent of the Parties limit the responsibility of each Party solely to its own acts, omissions, negligence or fault.

Nothing herein shall waive or amend any defense or immunity that a Party, its officers, agents or employees may have under the Pennsylvania Political Subdivision Tort Claims Act, 42 Pa.C.S.A. 8541 et. seq.

12. **COUNTY NOT LIABLE FOR MALFUNCTION OR DEFECT TO APPLICATION.**

The County shall not be liable to the Parties for (a) defects to, or malfunctions of, the Application; or (b) a defective or malfunctioning installation of the Application by CS or by any of CS's subcontractors or agents. No Party shall be liable to any other Party for defects to, or malfunctions of, the Application that are solely the result of actions or instructions given to CS by a Party specific to its own CAD system. No Party shall be liable for any interruption or interference with the operation of another Party's facility. No Party shall be liable for any special, indirect or consequential damages arising in any manner. The Parties shall promptly notify the County of any defects or malfunctions. The County shall use best efforts to cause CS to remedy any defects or malfunctions in the Application or associated hardware installed by CS.

13. **MISCELLANEOUS.**

a. **Best Efforts.** The Parties shall make their best efforts to expedite the installation of the Application. To the extent applicable, the Parties shall abide by the terms and conditions of the CS Contract.

b. **Assignability.** This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the respective Parties, and no Party shall assign or permit a change in control of any of the rights granted pursuant to this Agreement, without the written consent of the other Parties.

c. **Applicable Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

d. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement and any addenda and exhibits that may be attached hereto represent the entire agreement among the Parties. There are no collateral or oral agreements or understandings. The Parties and its agents have made no representations, agreements, conditions, warranties, understandings or promises, either oral or written, other than as set forth herein, with respect to this Agreement. This Agreement shall not be modified in any manner or terminated before the expiration of the term as set forth in this Agreement except by an instrument in writing executed by all Parties. Without limiting the enforceability of Section 13(h) of this Agreement, it is expressly agreed by the Parties that the confidentiality provision shall survive expiration or termination of this Agreement. No waiver of any portion of this Agreement shall be valid unless in writing and agreed to by the Party against whom it is being enforced.

e. **Severability.** The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Agreement, unless the invalidity or unenforceability would substantially deprive a Party of the benefits of this Agreement.

f. **Reserved.**

g. **No Joint Venture.** The Parties do not intend to create, and nothing contained in the Agreement shall be construed as creating, a joint venture arrangement or partnership among the Parties.

h. **Survival.** Any and all provisions set forth in the Agreement which, by its or their nature, would reasonably be expected to be performed after the termination of the Agreement shall survive and be enforceable after such termination. Any and all liabilities, actual or contingent, which shall have arisen in connection with the Agreement, shall survive any termination of the Agreement. Any express statement of survival contained in any Section of the Agreement shall not be construed to affect the survival of any other Section, which shall be determined pursuant to this Section.

i. **Other Party Interests.** Nothing in the Agreement, expressed or implied, is intended or shall be construed to confer upon or give to any person, firm, corporation, or legal entity, other than the Parties, any rights, remedies, or other benefits under or by reason of the Agreement.

j. **Counterpart Signatures.** This Agreement may be signed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument Agreement.

CAD DATA SHARING – Delaware County Area CAD-to-CAD Hub Implementation  
Project

**1. DELAWARE COUNTY AREA CAD-TO-CAD HUB IMPLEMENTATION PROJECT**

This Statement of Work (SOW) is attached to and subject to the terms and condition of the Software License and Services Agreement (Agreement) entered on \_\_\_\_\_ between CentralSquare and the County of Delaware (“Customer”).

Customer shall make reasonable efforts to obtain cooperation of the other SEPA Partners (as defined in the Agreement) as required to fulfill the requirements of this SOW.

**2. SOLUTION OVERVIEW**

This Statement of Work (SOW) is entered into between CentralSquare and Customer. CentralSquare is the leading provider of bi-directional CAD-to-CAD interoperability through its Unify implementation of the CAD-to-CAD Hub. This patented interoperability system utilizes an intelligent hub design to enable CAD systems to communicate directly with one or more other CAD systems and incorporates the interoperability information through the existing CAD consoles familiar to the dispatchers.

At the completion of this SOW, the SEPA Partners’ PSAPs will be able to share emergency incident related data electronically with each other. The scope includes the the SEPA Partners’ PSAPs who will be able to share emergency incident related data electronically with each other. These CAD systems will be integrated using the CAD-to-CAD Hub product to enable bidirectional sharing of incidents, unit updates, and unit locations.

**3. DELIVERABLES – SYSTEM CONNECTIONS**

3.1. CentralSquare will provide the SEPA Partners with access to a regional Hub for the purpose of the following agencies connecting the referenced CAD systems and version:

3.2. Standard CAD-to-CAD Hub Functionality For Project Implementation – The Customer is licensed to use the CAD-to-CAD Hub functionality as described in the SID “Section 1 – Hub Unify Standard Scope”.

3.3. Site-Specific Configurations – A discovery phase will take place that will identify site-specific configurations for the Hub. These will be documented in an Operational Scenarios Document (OSD) and signed off by the customer before the configuration phase begins.

3.4. Customizations – The following customizations are outside of standard functionality already described:

- a) Interface development for each CAD system (Hexagon iCAD, Versaterm CAD, and Tyler Technologies CAD) will be contracted separately from this agreement. A current NDA between CentralSquare and each CAD vendor (separately) must be in place for CentralSquare to provide its Unify SDK/API.
- b) Hexagon and Versaterm each have developed an interface from their respective CAD systems to the CST Hub. However, development fees may apply, and the cost of the interface (licensing, implementation, testing, and training if applicable) are not included in this project or affiliated pricing.
- c) The Tyler Technologies CAD Enterprise 2018.2 interface to the Hub for Berks County has not yet been developed will be contracted separately from this agreement.

#### 4. DELIVERABLES – PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

4.1. Documentation - Standard professional services deliverables are documented in the following appendices:

- a) “Exhibit E – Section 2 – Hub Unify - Professional Services Deliverables”
- b) “Exhibit E – Section 3 - Hub Unify - Implementation”
- c) “Exhibit E – Section 4 - Hub Unify - System Testing”

#### 5. CUSTOMER DELIVERABLES

5.1. The Customer agrees to perform the functions in the SID, “Exhibit E – Section 5 – Hub Unify - Customer Deliverables”.

5.2. Hub Server Cluster Hosting (if On Premise) – The SEPA Partners will provide all required server hardware and host the on-premise Hub server cluster. The server cluster is designed to provide scalability and redundancy to the Hub solution. Typical server clusters contain one load balancer, two app servers, and three database servers. Discovery for server resources may change the requirements for this project. All components may be virtualized.

#### 6. PROJECT TIMELINE LIMITATIONS

In order to maintain the forward progress of the implementation, select project periods are subject to the following limitations. Once the timeline limitation has been met, the deliverables for that period will be deemed automatically accepted and any associated milestones and invoicing will occur. A complete overview of project phases is found in the SID, “Exhibit E – Section 3 – Hub Unify - Implementation”.

## 7. ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA

CentralSquare and the SEPA Partners will use a standardized acceptance test plan for all work completed under this SOW to confirm the system meets the functional requirements of the COTS Hub system. Any defects that are raised will be prioritized as follows:

Priority	Description
P1: Critical Priority	A fatal software application error that prevents the system from starting/re-starting and/or a database integrity error.
P2: High Priority	Users are not able to use mission critical functionality necessary to capture or maintain their data. There is no known work-around or there is an unacceptable and production-limiting work-around.
Per industry standards, the system is considered ready for fielding when there are no known P1 or P2 defects.	
P3: Medium Priority	Users have an acceptable and defined work-around, which will allow them to continue or the problem will not inhibit production activity.
P4: Low Priority	This is a nuisance to the end-users, but is not a production-limiting problem.

## 8. PROJECT RISKS

The customization efforts involved when integrating the Bidirectional Adapters and interfaces with the CAD-to-CAD Hub includes several risks, the outcome of which are not completely certain until implementation and testing is complete. Based upon the differences of each CAD system, an agency may use different methods of sharing incidents and exchanging information through their connection to the Hub. Thus, actual functionality can vary widely by agency, even for those using the same make of CAD system. Accordingly, each agency is treated as a separate custom integration with inherent risks associated with configuration efforts. CentralSquare will discuss risk mitigation efforts with the SEPA Partners early in the discovery phase.
