Purpose

The purpose of the Planning Commission is to provide planning and information services that support smart growth, open space preservation, natural resource protection, historic preservation, livable communities, economic development, and efficient infrastructure.

Planning Commission Members

A nine-member commission appointed by the Chester County Board of Commissioners sets policy for our programs and services. The commission is composed of volunteer residents from all walks of life, including municipal officials, engineers, landscape architects, business people, and open space advocates.

Planning Staff

The staff consists of professionally trained planners and technicians who perform the duties of the commission. The staff has the expertise to assist you in addressing the most complex planning issues facing your community. We use the latest technology and research to address contemporary planning issues.



Vision Partnership Program (VPP)

This grant program provides both technical and financial assistance to municipalities in the preparation of comprehensive plans, ordinance updates, official maps, and special planning projects. Under the program, you can either choose the Planning Commission and its professional planners to perform these services or retain a private consultant.

If your municipality is considering a comprehensive plan update, we are happy to meet and provide information to facilitate the update process.

We offer technical assistance free of charge for planning guidance, reviews, and other limited efforts. More substantial assistance, such as drafting ordinance amendments, is available for a fee and based on staff availability.

Site Plan and Ordinance Review

All proposed comprehensive plans, zoning ordinances, subdivision ordinances, subdivisions, and land developments are reviewed by the Planning Commission for planning consistency.

We also offer an optional sketch plan review service that is free of charge and brings the municipality and developer together to create a better development.

Vision Partnership Program—PRESERVE Projects

This program can be used for:

- Preparing open space, park, and recreation plans; and
- Amending zoning ordinances to incorporate effective agricultural zoning, transfer of development rights, or cluster zoning.

Open Space Information and Guidance

The Chester County Planning Commission tracks open space preservation accomplishments, preservation tools, and open space initiatives, coordinating with many different partners. We also offer free guidance on open space tools and ordinances.

Department of Parks & Open Space Preservation

We often collaborate with the county Department of Parks & Open Space Preservation, which uses funds allocated by the county commissioners to help keep farmers on the land, provide safe and accessible places for families to play, and protect the county's woods and wildlife.

PROTECT

We promote protection of critical natural resources, including streams, wetlands, woodlands, steep slopes, and unique plants and animals.

Vision Partnership Program—PROTECT Projects

This program can be used for:

- Preparing resource protection plans;
- Conducting environmental and sustainability studies; and
- Amending zoning and subdivision ordinances that regulate floodplains, riparian corridors, wetlands, steep slopes, woodlands, and other natural areas.

Natural Resource Coordination

The Chester County Planning Commission tracks municipal achievements for natural resource protection and provides information on natural resource initiatives. We also offer free guidance on natural resource protection tools and ordinances.

Water Resources Authority

We often collaborate with the county Water Resources Authority, which provides flood protection, reservoir water supply, and water science information and planning to sustain the natural quality, quantity, and biodiversity of Chester County water resources.

- Historic resource surveys; and
- Historic preservation ordinances that protect historic resources and foster sensitive development.

Town Tours & Village Walks

Each year, the Planning Commission facilitates a series of public walking tours that reflect our historic resources and cultural landscape. These fun and informative tours rotate locations and topics, highlighting the rich story of Chester County.

Historic Resource Assistance

The county's Heritage Preservation Coordinator is available free of charge to the public and municipalities for guidance on the varying levels of historic resource designation, status of resource designation, and other limited efforts.

Agency Coordination

Planning Commission staff coordinates with many different historic preservation partners, working with local historic commissions, state and federal agencies, local municipalities, county departments, and many other partners.

The county's Urban Planner assists our urban centers with their planning needs. Map development, grant writing, data and information sharing, and other limited efforts are available free of charge. More substantial assistance, such as drafting ordinance amendments or preparing urban center revitalization plans, are available for a fee.
