

## **SAVE Supervision Sanction Notice**

Violations of SAVE supervision may be sanctioned as follows:

1. If you admit responsibility for the violation, you may receive 2 days in jail.
2. If you deny responsibility for the violation and the violation is confirmed to the court, you may receive 5 days in jail.
3. If you abscond for more than 48 hours, you may receive 10 days in jail and one additional day in jail for each day you are an absconder up to the 28<sup>th</sup> day.
4. If you attempt to provide a tampered/fake urine sample, you may receive 5 days in jail for the first attempt and removal from SAVE for a second attempt.
5. Consuming narcotics, from any source while in CCP. This includes, but is not limited to opiates, benzodiazepines or sleep aides. If you test positive upon release from CCP the sanction will be 30 days.

If multiple violations are committed during the same time period, sanctions may be run consecutive to one another.

If participants are employed and/or engaged in an accredited educational or vocational program at the time of a violation, a sanction may be deferred for the first violation only. Employment and educational programs must be verified by APO for the sanction to be deferred.

Additional sanctions may be imposed by the SAVE Judge or designee, which include additional reporting or compliance requirements, additional drug and/or alcohol testing and counseling/ treatment for behavioral or mental health issues.

Violations include:

- Failed drug or alcohol test
- Failure to appear for:
  - Drug and alcohol test (random or requested)
  - Probation/Parole officer appointment
  - Any other failure to appear without satisfactory effort to notify or reschedule
- Failing to obtain advanced permission before taking **any** medications as outlined in the random testing instructions.
- Contested positive drug tests that are later confirmed positive
- Violation of any general rule of supervision.
- Summary convictions.
- Failure to act in a compliant manner with any person associated with SAVE or providing services to SAVE or participant, including while in Chester County Prison.

Repeated violations may result in revocation of SAVE supervision through a Gagnon/Morrissey II hearing.

The following criteria may result in removal from SAVE:

- Criminal arrest or conviction while under SAVE supervision
- Absconding for more than 48 hours on three (3) occasions
- Absconder status for thirty (30) days.
- A second attempt at providing a tampered/fake urine.
- Disrespectful or violent behavior towards any person associated with SAVE, including any Correctional Officer or inmate at Chester County Prison while serving a sanction.
- Five (5) sanctions within six (6) months or ten (10) sanctions within the term of SAVE supervision
  - A sanction is defined as a court appearance with sanctions imposed regardless of the number of infractions addressed.
- A second admission into SAVE only allows for two (2) sanctions, and removal on the third sanction.
