## How to Apply for Permit(s)

### **Archery (white-tailed deer):**

1. READ, Remove and complete the *Participant Acknowledgement* statement on Page 1 and submit with your application.
2. Remove the appropriate pages of the *Archery Application* from this booklet.
3. Complete all information requested on the application.
4. **Beginning August 6, 2018**, submit the completed application no later than **Friday August 24, 2018 by 4:00 p.m.** to the park office indicated on Table 1. Only one application per person may be submitted - to one park only.
5. **Antlerless Hunting License Requirements: Parks with archery programs are within WMU 5C and now 5D as in the case with Black Rock Sanctuary and Exton Park ONLY and each participant is required to have at least one antlerless deer license for the appropriate WMU.**

### **Canada & Snow Goose Hunting:**

1. Complete application on pages 11 and 12 and submit to the Hibernia Park Office either in person or through the mail beginning on October 1, 2018.
2. All hunting party members must present a valid PA Hunting License, PA Migratory Game Bird License, and if 16 or older, a federal migratory duck stamp.

### **SAFETY STATEMENT**

Hunting within the boundaries of Chester County Real Estate is a privilege granted by the Chester County Commissioners through the Chester County Facilities and Parks Department. 2018 White-Tailed Deer Archery Program**

**A. WHITE-TAILED DEER MANAGEMENT GOALS AND OBJECTIVES**

White tail deer populations are to be managed on Chester County Real Estate consistent with current seasons, bag limits, and objectives established by the Pennsylvania Game Commission. It is the stewardship responsibility of the Facilities and Parks Department to recommend and affect means of population controls that meet these objectives. The chief objective in conducting regulated hunting programs as a means to manage deer populations is to strive towards sustainable forest ecosystems and to maximize biodiversity potential accordingly. The recreation benefit to Chester County and non-County residents is also recognized as a vital component of the deer and management strategies employed at each park site and each program type. The recreation benefit, stewardship responsibilities and the most efficient means to meet these components must be considered individually and collectively to ensure that the Facilities and Parks Department is in keeping with stated goals by using the most cost and time effective methods. Therefore, management strategies, the type and number of hunting programs will fluctuate from management cycle to management cycle as is demonstrated in this current year and described herein. As you will readily note, the firearms programs have been suspended at all dedicated park locations as has the general hunting program at Sanatoga, Linfield and Hatfield properties. This trend has been in practice at other park locations as being unnecessary and inefficient when weighed between management benefit and time and efforts required to employ this tool as has become the case too at Warwick and Nottingham Parks. Archery hunting programs are continued as the chosen tool at each of the parks and open space sites as being considered adequate for the current population trends and/or it is the only choice as is the case with Exton Park for example.

**B. ARCHERY RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR APPLICATIONS AND PERMITS**

1. The **short form** Archery Application (Page 7) is to be completed and submitted by returning participants only.
2. The **long form** Archery Application (Pages 7-9) must be completed by new applicants to the archery program.
3. Archery-Hunting permits will be awarded to permit holders from the previous year based on their demonstration of safety, successful participation, and adherence to the rules and regulations. This will limit the number of hunting permits available to new applicants.
4. Permits issued to new applicants shall be determined based on information listed on the application and successful demonstration of proficiency with archery tackle to be used in the program. Chester County Resident applications and Non-County Resident applications will be separated prior to the drawings. A lottery drawing will be conducted to fill permit vacancies beginning with Chester County Residents.
5. **Participants in the Archery Program are REQUIRED to demonstrate proficiency with archery tackle on a two-year (every other year) cycle.**
6. **Certification of completion of the PA Game Commission Successful Bowhunter Education course is required of all applicants and participants, no exceptions.**
7. Hunting – zone assignment is subject to successful completion of the proficiency test for new and returning applicants. The Park Manager will use discretion in area assignments based on past history of safe participation and success in Department archery programs.
8. Proficiency test for new hunters will be conducted from 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. on each of the dates listed in Table 1 (Page 4). Returning hunters may qualify beginning Monday August 6<sup>th</sup> by appointment.
9. Permits are non-transferable; and only valid for the 2018-2019 archery seasons for white-tailed deer, as established by the Pennsylvania Game Commission, or as designated by the Department.
10. **Beginning August 6, 2018**, prospective participants must submit an OFFICIAL DEPARTMENT application, to the appropriate County Park office **by 4:00 pm on Friday August 24, 2018**. No facsimiles of applications shall be accepted. ALL APPLICATIONS MUST BE SIGNED BY EACH APPLICANT. IF APPLICANT IS LESS THAN 16 YEARS OF AGE, APPLICATION MUST BE CO-SIGNED BY PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN.
11. Mail or deliver applications to the park site indicated on the last page of the application.
12. Successful applicants shall be notified by telephone if not present at the permit assignment.
13. Individuals may submit ONE application for permit assignment at the site of their choice, and may participate in ONE of the Department-sponsored archery programs.
14. All legal-age hunters are eligible, and if selected, hunters under the age of 16 years may apply with, and must be accompanied by, an adult at all times per PA Game Law. Applicants under the age of 16 must list the name of the accompanying adult if other than the co-signed.

*\*One application per hunter, per drawing and maximum of two (2) names may be submitted on each application.*

**\*\*Proficiency testing may be conducted as early as Monday August 6<sup>th</sup> for eligible returning hunters.**

### C. APPLICANT SELECTION PROCESS

- Applications for new participants in the archery hunting program requires individuals to submit **(Beginning August 6, 2018)** information regarding archery experience, personal vitae, game law compliance record, and references from landowners of properties hunted. The Park Manager or delegate shall validate this information for accuracy, and said information will be strongly considered when permits are issued.
- All applicants will be required to have taken the Pennsylvania Game Commission Successful Bowhunting Course by August 24, 2018 to be considered for application and participation. Copy of certification card is required as part of application process.
- Individuals who have not participated in the archery-hunting program and are chosen for a permit must demonstrate proficiency with the archery tackle to be used (while hunting) to qualify for a hunting permit. *(See Table 1 above.)* New participants must attend a **mandatory** meeting immediately following the permitting process at each park as listed in table above. Lottery drawing will be conducted to fill vacancies with new applicants beginning with Chester County Residents. Returning hunters are not required to attend the meeting; however, must schedule and meet with park staff to receive their permit beginning August 6<sup>th</sup>.
- Proficiency testing shall be conducted from 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. at the location indicated in Table 1 (above). **Eligible returning hunters may schedule their qualification beginning Monday August 6<sup>th</sup> by appointment.**
- Only those individuals selected as the result of the permit assignment on the September date listed per park or returnees to the archery program may participate in the proficiency process. **Each individual must pass the proficiency test to participate in the archery program.** Should two individuals apply together and only one pass the proficiency test, only the successful individual shall be issued a permit for that hunting area.
- The **proficiency test** shall require individuals using compound, recurve or longbow to place 3 of 4 arrows in the vital area of a target at 10 yards, 15 yards, and 20 yards. One (1) broadhead tipped arrow (type to be used in the hunting field) will also need to be accurately shot into the target at 20 yards. Individuals using crossbows shall be required to place 4 of 5 bolts in the vital area of a target at 20, 25, and 30 yards. Crossbow shooters will also be required to shoot one (1) broadhead tipped bolt (type to be used in the hunting field) accurately shot into the target at 25 yards. Shooting will be from an elevated location approximately 10 feet above ground level. The bow and arrows to be used for hunting shall be used for this process. This same rule applies for crossbows and crossbow

bolts. **Participants must re-test on an alternate year basis rather than once per five (5) years as has previously been the practice.**

#### D. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ARCHERY HUNTING

1. **BAG LIMITS** – Each participant, with appropriate licenses, may harvest one (1) antlerless deer for each legal antlerless license they possess.
2. Each participant must endeavor to harvest an antlerless female before a participant may harvest an antlered deer. Only antlered deer with a full set of antlers with an outside spread equal to, or greater than, the width of the outstretched ears of the deer may be harvested. **This rule will be strictly enforced and harvested antlered deer must be inspected by Park Manager or on duty Park Ranger.**
3. **HUNTING SEASON** - All applicable archery deer seasons as set forth by the Pennsylvania Game Commission for WMU 5C and 5D beginning September 15, 2018 and ending January 26, 2019. **New this year for parks- September 15<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup> DOE ONLY.**
4. **GENERAL PROCEDURES** – Participants must register before each hunting event and sign out following each event. Forms for this purpose shall be placed in a weatherproof box at a location to be determined. When in the field, hunters must carry the Department issued hunting permit on their person at all times
5. Harvested deer must be registered at the designated check station as per written instructions.
6. Participants must park their vehicles in the area designated for the assigned hunting area and display Department parking permit.
7. **ARCHERY TACKLE** – Must conform to that which is specified by the PA Game Commission for use during this season.
8. Participants must wear a blaze orange hat and vest/coat that meet the minimum square inch requirements specified by the PA Game Commission during the overlapping antlerless muzzleloader and statewide firearms deer seasons.
9. **Participants must hunt a minimum of 20 hours or harvest a mature (1.5 years of age minimum) female antlerless deer by December 8 to be considered for future archery programs as they may occur.** *Failure to do so may result in revocation of hunting privileges at the discretion of the Park Superintendent.*
10. **HUNTING ZONES** – Archery only hunting zones have been established for the white-tailed deer management program at each park and open space site as applicable and needed. The archery hunting zones have not been field marked, but are identified on the respective Deer Management Program Map, which is forwarded to all participants with their hunting permits. Participants may hunt in the **assigned area only**. The hunting areas are located outside of the developed recreational areas of the park for the safety of participants and park visitors and to minimize the opportunity for conflict of interests. Safety zone boundaries may exceed the 150-foot minimum, as is established statewide by the PA Game Commission, for a variety of reasons including respect for adjacent landowners. It is imperative that all hunters adhere to their area boundaries and safety zones accordingly. Maps illustrating all archery hunting areas will be issued to participants. Beginning November 26, hunters may hunt any archery zone on a first come - first served basis.
11. All participants, other than handicapped individuals and those certified by physician as unable, must hunt from an elevated platform commonly known as a treestand and must use a fall restraint system commonly known as a safety harness.
12. Reasonable efforts will be made to accommodate handicapped participants.
13. **TREESTANDS** – Participants may use portable treestands; self-climbing type is preferred. Fixed position stands will be considered, but type of stand and proposed location(s) of stands must be approved by Park Manager, and access to climbing devices by others must be restricted by removals or other approved means following each hunting event. Steps or other devices that pierce the outer and inner bark of trees are not permitted. *Participants must label fixed position stands with name and permit number.* **ALL TREESTANDS and TREE CLIMBING EQUIPMENT (i.e.; ladders) MUST BEAR THE TREESTAND MANUFACTURES ASSOCIATION (TMA ) LABEL. Treestands must be removed from County Real Estate by February 9, 2019. Participant failure to comply with this rule will be immediately removed from the hunting program.**
14. Failure to disable/remove climbing devices following hunting events may result in removal of treestand and climbing devices by park staff.
15. **PERSONAL SAFETY DEVICES** – all participants must wear a 5 point safety harness with current date tag affixed and be tethered to the tree at all times while ascending, occupying their treestand, and descending from the stand. **Participant failure to comply with this rule will be immediately removed from the hunting program.**

16. The County reserves the right to discontinue the program at any time.
17. Permits are not transferable.
18. Permit holders who cannot participate in the management program are asked to call the appropriate park office to allow staff to make timely adjustments.
19. The Pennsylvania Game Law and the Chester County Real Estate Rules and Regulations (governing county Parks) shall apply (rule #9 regarding hunting and #31 regarding use of weapons are suspended for the dates of this program only).

Participant deviation from the Chester County Real Estate Rules and Regulations Pennsylvania Game Law and the US Fish and Wildlife Service regulations shall not be tolerated. Such conduct, whether witnessed by, or reported to Department staff, shall be considered grounds for permanent expulsion from CCFPD hunting programs.

**Appropriate citations and fines will be issued.**

2018 – 2019 Canada & Snow Goose Hunting  
Hibernia County Park**

**A. MANAGEMENT GOALS AND OBJECTIVES**

To control and maintain the resident and migratory Canada goose population at a level to minimize nuisance problems in maintained public areas, while still providing viewing opportunities for park visitors.

Hunting for Canada and Snow/Blue Geese is again open for the 2018/2019 hunting season in established blind locations around Chambers Lake. Seasons and bag limits for geese must conform to those established by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. These seasons will be set in late summer, announced through the news media and will be available at the U.S. Post Offices in early September.

**B. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR PERMITS**

Goose hunting permits will be available for issuance on a first-come, first served basis beginning on **Monday, October 1**, Hibernia County Park in the park office and will continue to be issued each weekday thereafter until all permits have been issued. A limit of 25 permits will be issued. **All hunting party members must hold a valid 2018 PA Hunting License, 2018 PA Migratory Game Bird License, and if 16 or older, a 2018 federal migratory duck stamp.**

**How to Apply** - Complete participant acknowledgement statement on page 1 and complete application for goose hunting permits on pages 11 and 12. Submit original copies of each document at Hibernia Park on **October 1, 2018** or thereafter.

Goose hunting around Chambers Lake is limited to pre-established blind locations. Hunters who have obtained a hunting permit must use naturally existing blind material or use their own portable blinds. All portable blinds must be removed after each day of hunting. The use of decoys in the lake is permitted but must be removed at the conclusion of hunting.

**C. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR HUNTING**

1. Goose hunting is permitted in and around Chambers Lake during the regular and extended PA goose seasons.
2. Hunting hours commence at the onset of legal shooting hours and end at sunset each day of the season. Hunting is not permitted on Sundays.
3. Hunting activities and blinds must be within 20 yards of posted blinds. There are 6 total blinds.
4. Hunters must present evidence of attending and completing a hunter safety education course and/or meet PGC requirements for obtaining a Pennsylvania hunting license.
5. Each permit holder is allowed 2 additional fully licensed hunters per blind.
6. No more than three hunters per blind. Blinds will be available on a first come, first served basis, daily.
7. Participants must log in at a designated sign-in box (located at the lake kiosk) for each day in the field.
8. All State and Federal regulations governing the taking of waterfowl will apply, including the use of non-toxic shot.
9. Hunters are required to report any geese that are harvested, including any with neck or leg bands.
10. Hunters are not permitted to hunt within 150 yards of any occupied dwelling.
11. Hunting dogs must remain on a leash of no more than 6 feet in length unless in the act of retrieving a downed goose.
12. Shotguns must be plugged to hold no more than 3 shotgun shells. All hunters must possess a current resident or non-resident PA hunting license and a current federal migratory waterfowl stamp.
